Discernment for Lent

Wondering if you are going in the right direction? Is God calling you somewhere? Don't you wish there was some help with questions like these? Well, there just might be.

As you are aware, we are all blessed with various skills, talents and abilities. For some, there is a call to use their unique gifts in ordained ministry. This important decision is not one made in private. Anyone who feels called to an ordained ministry goes through a long, slightly more public process during which their perceived call is evaluated by the Church at large. This process is called discernment.

In its simplest definition, discernment is nothing more than the ability to decide between truth and error, right and wrong. Discernment is the process of making careful distinctions in our thinking about truth. It is where we trust others to help us find that truth. We use discernment to help determine our call.

Some ideas on discernment:

- Discernment is a journey rather than a destination
- Discernment is a prayerful, informed and intentional attempt to sort through all the voices to get in touch with God's spirit at work
- Discernment is a process that looks to the objective facts of the situation and to the inner yearnings of the individual for clues as to where one is called

Well, discernment is not just for folks going into the ministry. It can be used by anybody who has questions and needs guidance on a variety of different topics. I will be hosting a five week Lenten series that is intended to help you start through the process. You are most welcome to join us but please know that participation, discussion and trust are very important in this program.

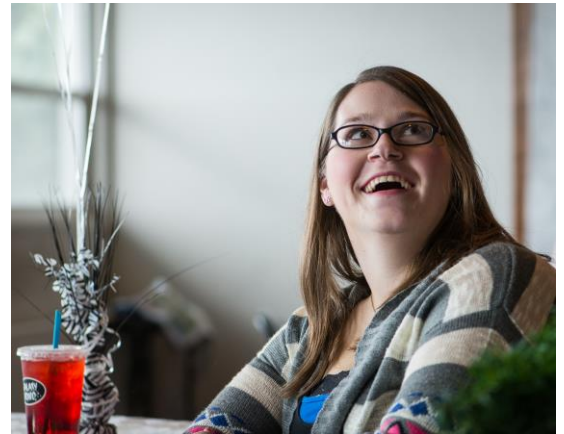
Bishop's Visit

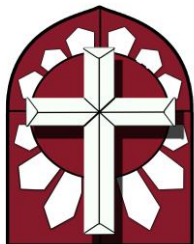
Lessons for January 24

FIRST LESSON: (Nehemiah 8:10) A great day in the history of Israel: in the restored city of Jerusalem Ezra gathers the people together that they may hear and understand the law of Moses.

PSALM: (Psalm 19) A hymn which glorifies the Creator God, with special praise for his law and a prayer for avoidance of sin.

SECOND LESSON: (1 Corinthians 12:12-31a) Paul describes Christians as the body of Christ. Each individual is a necessary part of that body.

GOSPEL: (Luke 4:14-21) Jesus returns to Galilee and enters the synagogue in Nazareth. Here he gives what has been called his inaugural sermon.
