Dear Friends,

Here are a few things I have been pondering this week:

Last Sunday evening Adam and I were chatting about the goodness of the morning, and in particular about the discussions that morning during coffee hour. Those present were able to listen to each other's views on the recent split between those Bishops of the wider Anglican Communion and the Episcopal Church. It was a wonderful, thoughtful, respectful discussion. Just speaking for myself, my only disappointment was that we did not hear more in the second discussion (after the 10:00 liturgy) from those who lean more towards the conservative side of this issue. But because we are a community beloved by Christ, always called to listen and learn from each other in love, we will hopefully be able to make many more regular opportunities on this, and many other important issues. It was a blessed morning just to start the discussion and to share our thoughts and passionate beliefs with one another.

True to form, that evening Adam started jotting down some of his own response to the issue of the Anglican Communion and the Episcopal Church. Also true to form, they are a little too long for this format. Here is an happening. This coming Sunday I invite everyone who can stay to enjoy hearing our Presiding Bishop Curry's famous sermon he preached at the General Convention last year. The sermon is entitled "**Crazy Christians.**" Here is an excerpt: *We need some Christians who are as crazy as the Lord. Crazy enough to love like Jesus, to give like Jesus, to forgive like Jesus, to do justice, love mercy, walk humbly with God—like Jesus. Crazy enough to dare to change the world from the nightmare it often is into something close to the dream that God dreams for it. And for those who would follow him, those who would be his disciples, those who would live as and be the people of the Way? It might come as a shock, but they are called to craziness.*

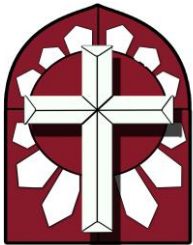
Lessons for March 6
