Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent is a good time to reflect on the WHY of why God has brought us together in this fine building. Being a church is never about sacrifice for its own sake. It is sacrifice for a purpose greater than us. Here are three divergent but interesting quotes that point to Lent's purpose.

**"I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt."**

-Pope Francis, suggesting that during Lent Christians should give up indifference toward other people and that any Lenten practice should benefit others (*Time*, February 18).

**"I get up every day with such a sense of purpose. I wish everyone could experience something like that once in their lifetime."**

-Marc Edwards, Virginia Tech professor who in 2004 exposed contamination in the Washington, D.C. water supply and was enlisted last year by a Flint, Michigan citizen to document the lead contamination there (*Washington Post*, January 27).

**FUTURE CHURCH:** Carey Nieuwhof predicts that the church of the future will be driven less by "consumer Christianity" and more by selfless discipleship. With the death of consumer Christianity, he says, worship will be less about what we get out of it and more about what we can give. Churches that endure will be less about the "already convinced" and more about the people on the margins of the church. **Effective churches will focus on the few things they can do well, rather than trying to provide a multitude of ministries** (*Christian Week*, January 25).

As we enter into our 5<sup>th</sup> week of Lent I get almost daily reports of how "the guys" are moving ahead, restoring our church's broken sewer line with a line now so well constructed it will (God willing) outlive us all. The work, stamina and commitment of "the guys" is what grace-in-action looks like. It also means we will continue as the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection. Because of their work the total bill for the project has moved from \$40,000 to slightly under \$20,000. As of last week we have already raised more than half of that. And now, thanks to Chuck Kieffer and his negotiations with the Church insurance company, we now have an additional \$4,400, (thank you Chuck!) WHICH MEANS WE STILL NEED \$8,600!

*Watch for the big St. Patrick's day Potluck/Party (pronounced Par-TAY) bash we are planning for WEDNESDAY, MARCH 16<sup>th</sup> to celebrate (the day before) St. Patrick AND the fine work of "the guys."* Hopefully by then we will be able to announce the completed donations needed to finish paying for of our new sewer line for the day-care center. (Just a reminder, besides their own fine work with young children, **Adventure Land Day Care** now provides us 1/3 of our needed budget each year.) All of this is about selfless discipleship.
