### Lessons for April 20

**FIRST LESSON:** (Acts 11:1-18) In defense of his earlier baptism of pagan believers, Peter demonstrates to the member of the Jerusalem church that God's intention to love Gentiles as well as Jews is revealed in Jesus' own testimony. In this way the mission to the Gentiles is officially authorized.

**PSALM:** (Psalm 148) The whole of creation and all peoples join together in praise of the Lord.

**SECOND LESSON:** (Revelation 21:1-6) John's vision shows us that in the resurrection the new age has dawned; God dwells with us already. Yet we wait for the time when the tears that cloud our vision will be wiped away. Then we will see the new heaven, new earth and new Jerusalem.

**GOSPEL:** (John 13:31-35) Jesus speaks to his disciples on the night that he is to be betrayed and handed over to death.
