Dear Friends,

Last week's visit to Alberta, Canada to interview one of the perspective Bishop candidates was an invigorating few days.

On the one hand, another member of the Search Committee and I met a talented and remarkable Church leader and his family. We then spent 2 ½ days interviewing the people who worked with the candidate or had benefitted from his ministry. One person after another talked about his gifts of strategic planning, and how it entailed that creative tension between knowing how to guide others into their own gifts and calling without micro managing. This particular leader had done it so well that they all said they even anticipated that the Church would even go on and grow without him. In no small way this reminds me of Jesus and the way he leaves us all equipped for what we need to do with God's Spirit in between us.

On the other hand, each day there we saw and heard news of the terrible fire still devastating much of Alberta, even as we speak. This particular church decided that between them they could help house 40 fire victims. Their church is not that much larger than our own!

This leads me to think about the vocation we all share. There is a great quote from a Irish poet/writer/priest named John O'Donohue in his book **To Bless the Space Between Us**. In it he talks about the "notion of vocation" and the "nature of call."

"Following one's vocation ensures that what you choose to do finds itself in harmony with your inner nature. It also means that this is the optimum way to unfold and develop whatever gifts one has. A vocation does not clear before you a smooth path . . . the light ahead is enough to guide only the next step." "The nature of the calling can change over time, taking a person down pathways never anticipated . . . opens new territories with the heart; this in turn deepens the calling itself. The faces of the calling change To develop a heart that is generous and equal to this complexity is the continual challenge of growth."

However each one of us now goes about the task of responding to our own call, may our ability to be generous, resilient, and flexible, even in the midst of our own complexity, be faithful and honed.

The Spirit that guides us is reliable, true, and challenging.

Pentecost- the birth of the Christian Church...

The word Pentecost is Greek and means fiftieth. During the Jewish celebration of Shavout/Pentecost, seven weeks or fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Apostles. In many ways, Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian church. The first event is recorded in the New Testament as the "Acts of the Apostles" chapter 2. God pours out the Spirit upon all who put their faith in Jesus Christ and becomes his disciples. (see Romans 8:1-11).

The color red is the color of Pentecost and symbolizes the power and tongues of fire.

The season of Pentecost usually focuses on the evangelical mission of the church to the world and its responsibility in carrying out that mission of proclamation given by God at Pentecost.

On this Pentecost wear red to celebrate the birth of Christian church and the act of the Holy Spirit.
