Go Green – Ordinary Time

Have you seen the ads on TV or the billboards “Go Green” around town? When I first saw the board on Nevada Street, I wondered? Without much thought my mind went to recycling. The board challenges us to consider what we can do to help our world and where to go to learn more about the program. When I went to the internet to read more about the program, I learned that it is an effort by the United States Postal Service through their stamp program, to encourage ways for each of us to help our environment. My children and families are really into recycling. My grandchildren remind me to rinse the can, pull off the label and put the can into the recycling barrel. It is their way to take care of their world. The USPS offers 16 stamps with ways for us to be good to our environment. They are: buy local produce recyclable bags, fix leaking faucets, share a ride, turn off lights when not in use, choose to walk, compost, let nature do the drying of clothes, recycle more, ride a bike, plant a tree, insulate your home, use public transportation, use efficient light bulbs, adjust the thermostat and maintain tire pressure. As you can see, there are many ways to be good to our environment, some easier than others. Which one(s) are you doing? Just one is better than none!

How does this relate to our church, to the practice of our faith? It is the Ordinary Time. It is the time to focus on **Hope of the New Life** (the hope of new life in the resurrection). It is the period between Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost) and the beginning of Advent. The scriptures of the Ordinary Time talk of growth, peace and hope. The color green is used because it is the symbol of New Life and Growth. Doesn't this have meaning for us? It is our mission to take care of our environment and the world we live. Our past is our heritage, we must take care of the present, so it will be there for the future. Aren't we commissioned to bring hope, peace and growth to our world? What can each of us do?

Pentecost- the birth of the Christian Church...



The word Pentecost is Greek for fiftieth. During the Jewish celebration of havout/Pentecost, seven weeks or fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Apostles. In many ways, Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian church. The first event is recorded in the New Testament as the "Acts of the Apostles" chapter 2. God pours out the Spirit upon all who put their faith in Jesus Christ and becomes his disciples. (see Romans 8:1-11). The color red is the color of Pentecost and symbolizes the power and tongues of fire. The season of Pentecost usually focuses on the evangelical mission of the church to the world and its responsibility in carrying out that mission of proclamation given by God at Pentecost. On this Pentecost wear red to celebrate the birthday of the Christian church and the act of the Holy Spirit. ~L. Bordwell

FIRST LESSON: (2 Samuel 11:26-12:10, 13-15) The conclusion of the sorry tale of David's adultery with Bathsheba whose husband Uriah was led to his death in battle at David's command.
