This is such a rich blessing, particularly when volunteers and food are in their regular summer slump. Thanks to everyone for your help on whatever level. As we know too well, the poor don't get time off for vacation.

Next week I will be the Chaplain at Camp Cross for a new venture, the Art's Camp. Please say a prayer. I love rugged camping, (or at least I used to), but anything over 90 is going to be a rude wake-up call about how most of the world tries to cope. I am such a wimp.

Dear Friends in Christ,

I write you today about the West Central Episcopal Mission located at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Spokane.

As many of you know we began the WCEM in October 2013 when it became apparent that the call to serve in the West Central neighborhood had clearly evolved from offering a more traditional worship in Holy Trinity to responding more intentionally and compassionately to the basic needs for food and ongoing support of the residents in the neighborhood. This reality is reflected in the status of West Central as a specialized mission.

While a range of ministries and support are offered through the WCEM, the primary essential ministry is the "Dinner Table" offered every Wednesday evening. This is a proven, inviting ministry that regularly fills the Parish Hall with our guests from the neighborhood.

As this ministry continues there is an ongoing need for volunteers from local churches. I sincerely hope that members of our congregations, and other churches, will volunteer to support this vital mission. A sign-up sheet is available for those who are interested in learning more and open to serving as a volunteer. Those who serve and those who are served continue to find this ministry transformative, hope-filled, and life giving.

The ministry you will be asked to offer will be one of the following:

- 1. Table Host and Greeter: Simply greet and sit at table with guests.
2. Cleaning Crew: Clean up after dinner and help with dishes.
3. Kitchen Crew: Help the Kitchen Coordinator prep food for dinner.

### Lessons for July 3

**FIRST LESSON:** (1 Kings 5:1-14) Naaman, a Syrian general, suffers from leprosy. In his passage Elisa miraculously cures his illness, but only after Naaman realizes, with the help of his servants, that his real problem lies in his pride.

**PSALM:** (Psalm 30) A hymn of praise and thanksgiving by one whom the Lord has saved from death.

**SECOND LESSON:** (Galatians 6:1-16) Paul closes his letter to the Galatians with an appeal that they bear their own responsibilities and help one another, when remembering that nothing counts in comparison with the glory of Christ's savings cross.

**GOSPEL:** (Luke 10:1-11, 16-20) Jesus appoints seventy missionaries to go before him and gives them their instructions.
