Anyone who has ever held a job understands the frustration that comes about when you are asked for information or to perform a task that your predecessor did not pass on in your training process, if there was a training process. In February, the Diocese asked our office for the confirmation information of a Parishioner from 1958. It took 6 months to find the documentation, which was less than 5 feet from my desk, but that I had never had a need to go through. Over the last 5 years, I have had the privilege of working with many members of this church, who have dedicated numerous hours of their lives to fulfilling a Vestry position here. Hopefully this information will help prevent our next seat holders from wondering what happened, and allow us to be able to focus more on how we can prepare or prevent future issues from occurring.

Lessons for August 14

FIRST LESSON: (Isaiah 5:1-7) The prophet sings a sad parable about God's vineyard, Israel, and the destruction which must now come upon it.

PSALM: (Psalm 82) God pronounces judgment on the heavenly beings who have failed to defend the weak and the poor. The people call on God himself to judge and rule the earth.

SECOND LESSON: (Hebrews 11:29-12:2) In a long list of biblical heroes, we find examples of trust in God that enabled them to face the trials of life faithfully. In addition to this "cloud of witnesses," we have Jesus, the perfect model of faithful endurance.

GOSPEL: (Luke 12:49-56) Jesus foresees difficult times ahead: his own ordeal and the necessity of division even within families.
