Dear Friends,

Tis the season of stewardship. As you ponder what, if anything, to pledge or contribute, may I mention that I've heard that Episcopalians are some of the most generous people around? We give the church, on average, 2 ½ percent of our income. Here is a simple statistic that is true for us. If everyone who was able at the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection would bump their current offering up 1% more, we would be absolutely fine for accomplishing our many vital goals the Vestry has outlined for the coming year (see last week's letter from Martha Sherwin)!

One book I would highly recommend that has helped Adam and me on our own decisions around tithing: Kerry Alys Robinson's **Imagining Abundance** (Liturgical Press, 2014, 36,37). I love this, her brief meditation on winning the lottery.

"Winning the lottery" implies a random, undeserved gift of good fortune awarded by chance. Hasn't each of us already won?

Perhaps we have won the lottery with our health or with loving relationships with our parents or children or siblings. Maybe we have won the lottery with our intellectual or creative aptitude, the opportunity for meaningful work, the chance to be paid for a job we adore, talents we get to employ for the common good, a superb sense of style, charisma, charm, or an excellent sense of humor. Perhaps we won the lottery with a marriage or life partnership of profound mutual love, support, and respect. Maybe we won the lottery with physical safety, emotional security, shelter, enough food for our families and ourselves. Perhaps we won the lottery by being able to attend wonderful schools, with inspiring teachers, or by having the ability to provide that opportunity for our children. Others of us may have won the lottery with the gift of faith, an abiding trust in Providence, an irrepressible hope, or a profound awareness of the beauty of creation and the dignity of humankind.

How has God blessed your own lottery? You are all on my list!
