Lessons for November 13

FIRST LESSON: (Isaiah 65:17-25) A blessed time when God will overcome many of life's shortcomings and frustrations.

PSALM: (Canticle 9) In this hymn taken from Isaiah 12:2-6, Isaiah unveils the full dimensions of God's intentions for his people.

SECOND LESSON: (2 Thessalonians 3:6-13) Paul deals with the problem of those who are so expectant that the Lord will come soon and are so meddlesome in the affairs of others that they have given up their daily work.

GOSPEL: (Luke 21:5-19) The disciples are forewarned of the destruction of the Jewish temple and of great upheavals in the natural and supernatural order which must take place before the end of history.
