Dear Friends,

An English missionary named Roland Allen once told about an older missionary who came up and introduced himself to him one day after he had delivered a sermon.

The older man said that he had been a medical missionary for many years in India. He served in a region where there was an environmental condition that was causing progressive blindness in many of the people of that region. People were born with healthy vision, but there was something that caused people to lose their sight as they grew older.

As time went on, this medical missionary developed a treatment that would stop this progressive blindness. So people came to him and he performed his treatment and people were no longer going blind. Because of him their sight had been saved.

The old missionary noted that they never said, "Thank you," because that phrase was not in their dialect. Instead, they spoke a word that meant, "I will tell your name."

*Wherever they went, they would tell the name of the person who had cured their blindness. They had received something so wonderful that they eagerly told others.* (1)

This coming Sunday we hear about a man who was also healed of blindness and who also eagerly told others what had happened to him. Jesus is still all about helping the cataracts fall from our eyes. Come and hear all about it. More importantly, come and see!

This past week we mailed a cashier's check for \$900.00 to Saint Matthew's Anglican school in the little village of Pomona, Belize.
