Resurrection Welcomes Prayers & Squares

We are now officially Prayers and Squares Chapter 1243 affiliated with Prayers and Squares International. It has taken a bit of effort for Jean Baker and myself to start this ministry here at ECOR and we would hope that you, as the congregation, will embrace our efforts.

This is not an individual effort but a combination of those who build the quilts and prayers from you in the pews. When a quilt is designated for a recipient, we will ask Reverend Linda to bless the quilt during our worship service by leading a prayer or a method of her choosing. Next we will present the quilt to you to be tied. Each knot in the prayer quilt is representative of a prayer that is said for the special need of the recipient. Information on a note pinned to the quilt will tell of that special need. We will display this quilt near the door of the church so as to make it easy for everyone to stop for a few seconds, pray for the recipient and tie a knot in the quilt.

Each quilt is hand made by volunteers. The more hands helping, the more quilts we will be able to give to those in need. Not everyone is a sewer. There is much work that is done in assembling and inserting the ties to be knotted without ever using a sewing machine. All are welcome to join us in the parish hall every Saturday morning at 9:00 am until 11:00 am, depending on the amount of assembly there is to do, we may not stay the full 2 hours. You are welcome to bring your machine and use the time to piece a quilt, or just help to put quilts together.

This is a ministry in which I have been a part when we spend the winter in Yuma, Arizona. These quilts provide comfort and ease to those who need our prayers for healing. It is not as much about the quilt as it is about the prayers. It is a most fulfilling ministry in that I have heard some pretty miraculous stories about the recipients of these quilts. For me, this is a visible and invisible (prayers) sign of God's love for us here on earth.

Please join us on Saturdays. If you are unable to come, we could use your donations of fabric and or dollars in order to purchase the batting.
