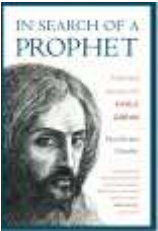

Lessons for October 1

FIRST LESSON: (Exodus 17:1-7) The people are at the point of rebellion because they are without water in the wilderness.

PSALM: (Psalm 78:1-4, 12-16) A hymn of praise to the mighty king who is raised up and enthroned on high.

SECOND LESSON: (Philippians 2:1-13) Paul bids the new disciples to be of one mind in love, knowing how Christ Jesus accepted the condition of a servant and was obedient to the point of death. We now confess him as Lord and are called to an obedient working out of our faith.

GOSPEL: (Matthew 21:23-32) Jesus tells a parable of two sons who obeyed their father differently, and he indicates that it is the same with those who are apparently obedient and disobedient in this age.
