Lessons for September 10

FIRST LESSON: (Exodus 12:1-14) Instructions are given, and the meaning of the Passover meal is told: it is a remembrance and reenactment of Israel's beginnings as a people when they were saved out of slavery in Egypt.

PSALM: (Psalm 149) A joyful song in which the faithful praise the Lord and anticipate the victory of justice.

SECOND LESSON: (Romans 13:8-14) Paul summarizes the heart of the law and urges a way of life in full awareness of the nearness of salvation.

GOSPEL: (Matthew 18:15-20) Teaching about how to deal with sin and grievances within the Christian community.
