Lessons for October 29

FIRST LESSON: (Leviticus 19:1-2, 15-18) The people of Israel are called to lives of justice and love – to be holy because the Lord their God is holy.

PSALM: (Psalm 1) The Lord makes fruitful the lives of those who choose the way of righteousness.

SECOND LESSON: (1 Thessalonians 2:1-8) Paul recalls his first visit to the Thessalonians, the troubles he endured, and the straightforward and gentle way in which he presented the gospel.

GOSPEL: (Matthew 22:34-46) Jesus presents the double commandment of love for God and neighbor, and then asks a question concerning whose son the Christ is.
