Notre Dame Professor Fr. Daniel Goody Discussed Theology Migration Nov 2 at Gonzaga

On Thursday November 2, at 6pm in the Hemmingson Center Ballroom, Father Daniel Goody, associate professor of theology and global affairs at Notre Dame University, will discuss "Passing Over: Migration, Theology and the Eucharist". This event is free and open to everyone.

The lecture is centered on the question: What does it mean to be witness to the body of Christ amid divisive and polarizing rhetoric around migrants and refugees today? The lecture will explore the integral connection between what happens inside and outside of churches by examining the relationship between those who cross borders today and the One who crossed over into our world in the incarnation. Other topics include arguments around migration today, key challenges that the global family faces and ways of looking at migration from a theological perspective.
