Sometimes clergy move on, become ill, or die. They too are held in love. We are all blessed to live and work with you in a Diocese endowed with such love.

This morning we prayed this prayer. It touches on our journey together at Resurrection.

Would you like to meet the same God that loves and calls you each day? *Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John* is a six-week Lenten journey into deeper intimacy with God through praying with the words of John the Evangelist. Using the journal I handed out last week (I will have more on hand by Ash Wednesday) we will meditate daily on a verse from John, encouraging participants to respond through words, images, or however the Spirit leads. Those who subscribe online also receive daily a short video in which a monastic brother from the Society of Saint John the Evangelist shares comments on the daily Gospel verse, having a relationship with Jesus, and possibilities for further reflection. There is so much going on. What a blessing to remember who brings us together, and why.
